Tech Trek Dorm Mum Experience

This year I had planned to be a dorm mum at the Sonoma State Tech Trek camp held in June but gave my place to another lady who was very keen to experience being a dorm mum. So, I was alternate as well as being the alternate for the Davis camp. I never got called to go to either and as the second alternate for the second Sonoma camp in July I thought the chances of being called to go would be practically none. How wrong was !!

Powered by AAUW California The director of the first Sonoma camp had an accident at that camp and broke bones in her arm and leg. So, she was out of action for the second Sonoma camp. Fortunately, Carol Holzgrafe, who was on the AAUW Board until this past June, stepped in to be director. She had planned to be a dorm mum at the camp, and then two other dorm mums couldn't come, so they were now looking for three dorm mums at the last minute. So, I was asked by Carol, about 5 days before camp started, to be a dorm mum – how could I say no! This would be my eighth time as a dorm mum at either Davis or Sonoma.

The week went well. I had a great group of girls, who bonded well together with no clicks forming. I had a few new experiences with my group of girls but all were resolved. I think we are all learning that times have changed since we were first dorm mums. Some of the issues we must deal with are quite different than they were 10 years ago!

Sonoma camp is quite different from the Davis camp regarding the dorms. At Sonoma we stay in housing very like town houses, whereas at Davis we stay in one building with dorm rooms on each floor. I had 5 girls in my house, and 4 of them were next door with the junior counselor. The girls are two toa-room with their own bathroom. I had my own room with a bathroom, and I had one girl in a single room. We always met in the living area of my house for dorm time.

The days are long and very busy. We have breakfast at 7:45, and then the girls go to their core classes at 9 am each morning. The core classes were Botany, Engineering, Robotics and Chemistry. Then it is lunch at 12:30 and after lunch they go to various workshops. Dinner is at 5:30 and in the evenings they have other activities including professional women's night, game night, and astronomy, unfortunately it was cloudy that night, but they did get to see all the telescopes in the observatory. There was a field trip to the Sonoma Water Agency which was very interesting. Most days they do not get back to the dorms until after dinner, and sometimes not until after the evening activity. As I said the days are long. Lights out is 10 pm and I have to say my girls this year were ready for bed by 10!

The last night they have what is known as build it night. During the week they design a structure that must be free standing and built with newspapers. They spend any spare time rolling newspapers into thin straws of various lengths. At night they have one hour to build their design, they are given masking tape, scissors, and some extra newspaper if they need it. It is fun seeing all the designs, this year there was a dragon, a dinosaur, the Golden Gate Bridge, a grandfather clock, a rollercoaster and Ferris wheel, a telephone booth and my girls did a British telephone box. I am always impressed by how they do it. When the girls had to tell what they had

made etc., my group did a skit with one on the phone and one outside pretending to talk and all were speaking in English accents about their dorm mum and camp, they were so funny. Of course, I knew nothing about this until that night.

We do a lot of walking, someone said it was ³/₄ mile from our dorms to the cafeteria, I am not sure it was that far, but most days I walked 4 to 6 miles! The food is plentiful, and I know I eat twice as much there than I do at home, especially cookies as they are so good. I thought I had gained weight but apparently, I didn't, mind you I didn't lose any either!

Another thing that is different at Sonoma than Davis is the weather. It is much cooler in Sonoma than it is in Davis in July. We had a couple of days in the nineties, but most days were in the eighties, and it always cooled down at night.

Everyone goes home tired, but the experience they had during the week will be with them for a lifetime.
